

Attendees explore the world of art through presentations on famous artists and their works, accompanied by delicious food and drink. This popular series has quickly become a cherished local tradition, providing a warm and inviting space for artcurious folks to connect and be inspired.





Libby Allen Art Competition & Exhibition

The Libby Allen Art Competition & Exhibition celebrates the vibrant artistic talent of Overton County's young creators. Following last year's inaugural event, which drew enthusiastic participation from across the community, we're thrilled to continue this tradition in April of 2025. High school students will once again have the opportunity to showcase their original works and compete for recognition, monetary awards, and a scholarship to Tennessee Tech's School of Craft, Art & Design—all while furthering our commitment to nurturing the next generation of artists in our region.





In October 2024, the inaugural Paint Livingston Plein Air Competition welcomed **38 artists** from across the Southeast, resulting in **115 original paintings**—nearly half of which were sold to eager patrons. The event had a substantial economic impact. OCAC, artists, and visitors invested thousands of dollars in local accommodations, goods, and services. Paint Livingston received overwhelmingly positive feedback, establishing Livingston as a vibrant cultural destination.
